Development authority working to make downtown secure

They can park in Miami Parking Authority garages and they can jump in those Freebees. We call them circulators, and they [people] can go around downtown

"We have the façade improvement, which is a grant that is offered [and] is ... \$50,000," said Mr. Reyes. "That is to individual businesses and property owners that can use that to enhance the overall appearance of the property ... to do away with the blight appearances, if there is one."
