"Putting the Magic Back into the City" was the focus of a well-attended virtual meeting of Miami's Downtown Development Authority (DDA) Friday, as directors floated strategies to right Miami's Covid-19 stricken

locals can support our businesses," said a report by Ivery Boston III, authority insight and innovation manager. "Downtown Miami will have to demonstrate that we are ready for the "new normal."

Sanitizing efforts may be key, said Manolo Reyes, authority chair and Miami commissioner. That might include having all passengers screened from hot spots (currently New York, New Jersey and Connecticut) on arrival, he added, as well as meticulous maintenance throughout all of Miami.
